It also highlights the environmental and social benefits, such as increased urban green spaces and enhanced community engagement, as well as the difficulties faced in achieving consensus and managing the complexities of the application process. By comparing these two cities, the study aims to shed light on the broader implications of GPB and its potential as a tool for sustainable urban development.
